The facility failed to ensure staff performed proper hand hygiene and glove changes during incontinence care. Findings: Review of the facility's policy titled, Incontinent Care: Bladder revealed the following, in part: Policy: Perineal management is the cleansing of the perineal area that includes the genitalia and rectal areas. Perform handwashing or use alcohol gel. 8. Put on disposable gloves. 10. For male perineal care: e. Turn to sidelying position and wash, rinse, and dry the anal area. 11. Remove and discard gloves. 12. Perform handwashing or use alcohol gel. 13. Change the gown and bed linens if needed. Resident #1 Review of Resident #1's clinical record revealed he was admitted to the facility on [DATE]. Resident #2 Review of the Resident #2's clinical record revealed he was admitted to the facility on [DATE]. On 03/25/2026 at 8:41 a.m., an observation was made of S2CNA providing incontinence care for Resident #1. S2CNA donned clean gloves and used clean perineal wipes to remove bowel movement off of Resident #1's buttocks. S2CNA then, without changing gloves or performing hand hygiene, placed a clean incontinence pad and brief under Resident #1's buttocks. S2CNA proceeded to place the soiled brief and urine soaked bed pad at the foot of Resident #1's mattress on top of Resident #1's clean comforter. S2CNA then disposed of the soiled brief into Resident #1's trash can. S2CNA spread the clean incontinence pad on Resident #1's bed, and secured the clean brief to Resident #1. S2CNA undressed Resident #1, touched the closet door and Resident #1's clean clothes, back, back of his head, both of his hands, both of his arms and both of his legs. S2CNA touched Resident #1's wheelchair arm rests, transferred Resident #1 into the wheelchair, opened the resident's door, and wheeled Resident #1 into the hallway. S2CNA then returned to Resident #1's room, retrieved the soiled incontinence pad, and carried it down the hall to dispose of it in the soiled linen barrel. S2CNA then disposed of his gloves. S2CNA was not observed to change soiled gloves or complete hand hygiene during Resident #1's incontinent care. On 03/25/2026 at 8:58 a.m., an observation was made of S2CNA and S3CNA performing incontinence care of Resident #2. Without performing hand hygiene, S2CNA and S3CNA donned clean gloves and turned Resident #2 to his right side. S2CNA used clean perineal wipes to remove bowel movement off of Resident #2's buttocks. S2CNA disposed of the soiled brief into the trash. S2CNA then removed the soiled gloves, and without performing hand hygiene, applied clean gloves. S2CNA then touched Resident #2's bedside table, left leg, right leg, left arm, and bed sheets. S2CNA applied a clean brief to Resident #2 and a clean incontinence pad to Resident #2's bed. S2CNA proceeded to remove soiled gloves, applied clean gloves, and placed a clean gown on Resident #2. At that time, S2CNA touched Resident #2's neck, bilateral arms, and back. S2CNA was not observed to perform hand hygiene during the above observation. S3CNA unfastened Resident #2's brief and confirmed Resident #2 was still soiled with bowel movement. S3CNA wiped Resident #2's buttocks with clean perineal wipes to remove the remaining stool. S3CNA and S2CNA secured the clean brief back on Resident #2. S3CNA exited Resident #2's room to obtain the soiled linen barrel. S2CNA discarded the soiled linens and his dirty (continued on next page)</p>

S3CNA was not observed to change soiled gloves and neither CNA was observed to perform hand hygiene during Resident #2's incontinence care. On 03/25/2026 at 9:12 a.m., an interview was conducted with S2CNA. S2CNA confirmed the observations above. S2CNA confirmed he should have removed his soiled gloves, performed hand hygiene, and applied clean gloves after removing bowel movement from Resident #1 and #2 and prior to moving to a clean area. S2CNA confirmed he should not have placed the soiled brief and incontinence pad on Resident #1's clean linen. S2CNA confirmed he did not perform hand hygiene between glove changes, after removing soiled gloves, and between resident care, and should have. On 03/25/2026 at 9:15 a.m., an interview was conducted with S3CNA. S3CNA confirmed she should have performed hand hygiene and changed gloves after she wiped Resident #2 and before she put the clean diaper back on. S3CNA confirmed she did not perform hand hygiene upon removing soiled gloves and exiting Resident #2's room and should have. On 03/25/2026 at 12:35 p.m., an interview was conducted with S1DON. She confirmed staff should change their gloves when soiled and when moving from a contaminated to a clean area during resident care. She confirmed staff should sanitize their hands between glove changes and between residents. She confirmed soiled linen should not have been placed onto clean linen.</p>
