Based on observation, interview and record review, the facility failed to protect R2's right to be free from physical abuse by R6 and R4's right to be free from verbal abuse by staff. Findings Include: R2: Review of the medical record reflected R2 admitted to the facility on [DATE], with diagnoses that included multiple sclerosis and epilepsy (seizure disorder). The admission Minimum Data Set (MDS), with an Assessment Reference Date (ARD) of 2/2/26, reflected R2 scored 15 out of 15 (cognitively intact) on the Brief Interview for Mental Status (BIMS-a cognitive screening tool) and had upper and lower extremity (arms and legs) impairments on both sides that interfered with daily functions or placed them at risk of injury in the last seven days. On 3/25/26 at 4:25 PM, R2 was observed seated in a wheelchair, in the day room. R2 was assisted to her room, by staff. R2 alleged that approximately three weeks prior, in the day room, R6 was intoxicated and choked her. R2 alleged R6 then slapped her on the left arm really hard, which left red marks. R2 reported prior to the alleged incident, R6 had been talking in a normal tone. R2 reported R6 used one hand to choke her, grabbing the front of her neck, and she was unable to breathe. R6: Review of the medical record reflected R6 admitted to the facility on [DATE] and readmitted [DATE], with diagnoses that included thyrotoxicosis and atrial fibrillation. The admission MDS, with an ARD of 1/5/26, reflected R6 scored 12 out of 15 (moderate cognitive impairment) on the BIMS. On 3/26/26 at 10:52 AM, R6 was observed seated in his wheelchair, in the hallway. R6 self-propelled his wheelchair back to his room. R6 reported knowing R2, stating R2 called the police and pressed charges. R6 stated, I guess I smacked her. R6 stated he had been drinking beer at a family member's house before being dropped off at the facility. R6 stated he did smack R2's arm but did not remember doing it. R6 stated it was an open-hand smack, from what he was told. R6 denied putting his hands on any other part of R2's body, including her neck. A facility investigation reflected that on 2/26/26 at approximately 8:00 PM, in the first-floor day room, R6 hit R2 on the left arm. R2 was noted to have a red mark on her left upper arm. According to the investigation, R6 appeared intoxicated at the time of the alleged incident and had an open can of beer next to him, in his wheelchair. Registered Nurse (RN) E was at the medication cart, just outside the day room when she heard a noise that sounded like a slap, and R2 called out. R2 stated R6 had just hit her on the arm. RN E noted that R6 was in his wheelchair, next to R2, at the time. Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) F was standing in the day room, with his back to the R2, when he heard a slapping noise and R2 call out. CNA F turned and saw R6 sitting next to R2. In a phone interview on 3/26/26 at 8:34 AM, RN E reported while passing medications, she heard a slap-like sound and heard R2 say ouch. RN E reported she ran into the day room. According to RN E, she could see on R2's face that she was hurt, and there was mild redness on her left arm that night. R6 had been dropped off at the facility by a family member and was noted to be intoxicated, according to RN E. She reported catching R6 drinking alcohol a couple minutes before hearing the slap-like sound. RN E stated R2 had been talking to another male resident, which R6 was watching and did not like. When the other male resident went outdoors to smoke, R6 approached R2. She reported CNA F was in the day room at the time of the interaction but was not facing the residents. <p>F 0600</p> <p>Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm</p> <p>Residents Affected - Few</p>	<p>According to RN E, R2 did not allege that R6 grabbed her around the neck or attempted to choke her. CNA F was unable to be reached for an interview during the onsite survey. According to the facility's investigation, resident to resident physical abuse, as a result of R6 hitting R2 in the left upper arm, was substantiated. Per R6's own admission, he had been drinking beer prior to returning to the facility and did not recall the incident. The investigation reflected the allegation of choking could not be substantiated. R4:Review of the medical record reflected R4 admitted to the facility on [DATE] and readmitted [DATE], with diagnoses that included chronic diastolic (congestive) heart failure, diabetes and unspecified dementia. The Quarterly MDS, with an ARD of 3/3/26, reflected R4 scored seven out of 15 (severe cognitive impairment) on the BIMS. According to a facility investigation, on 2/5/26, former Nursing Home Administrator (NHA) K self-reported that staff alleged he yelled/raised his voice at a resident. According to the facility's investigation, the interview with former NHA K reflected it had been reported to former NHA K that R4 had taken another resident's wallet, with money in it. The nurse and CNAs tried to get the wallet from R4, but he would not allow it. It was reported R4 was in his room, hollering, swearing and making a big commotion, and staff needed former NHA K to go see R4. Social Services Assistant (SSA) C, former NHA K and Scheduler G entered the room of R4, who was upset, cursing and hollering at the top of his voice, according to the investigation. R4 kept saying it was his money. After trying to get R4 to speak with staff, and his constant hollering, former NHA K raised his voice at R4 and said, [R4] quit hollering, we don't need to be hollering. According to the statement, that calmed the situation enough so staff could continue. Scheduler G asked R4 about the wallet, and R4 said it was his wallet, his money, and he had it for a long time. According to the investigation statement, two CNAs were asked to enter the room due to being familiar with R4. The statement reflected former NHA K opened the wallet, removed \$24, which he counted in front of SSA C. R4 stated it was his f**king money. Former NHA K gave R4 the money, which he put in his pocket. According to the investigation, it was in fact R4's wallet that was in his possession. In an interview on 3/25/26 at 11:10 AM, Scheduler G reported that during the interaction pertaining to the wallet, R4 was swearing at former NHA K and calling him a mother f**ker. Scheduler G reported former NHA K turned around and called R4 a mother f**ker. Scheduler G reported she grabbed former NHA K's arm and tried to guide him out of the room, twice. In an interview on 3/25/26 at 11:33 AM, CNA H reported observing the interaction between former NHA K and R4 from the doorway of R4's room, pertaining to the wallet. CNA H stated R4 called former NHA K a name. Former NHA K got in R4's face, pointed, told R4 he was not going to talk to him like that, then called R4 a mother f**ker. CNA H stated former NHA K seemed mad, and his face turned red. In a phone interview on 3/25/26 at 1:05 PM, former NHA K denied using profanity or calling R4 names. NHA K denied being frustrated during the interaction with R4 and just raised his voice to stop R4 from hollering. In a phone interview on 3/25/26 at 2:42 PM, CNA I reported directly witnessing the interaction between former NHA K and R4 pertaining to a wallet. CNA I stated she could not recall all of what was said, but former NHA K definitely called R4 a mother f**ker. On 3/25/26 at 1:40 PM, R4 was observed sitting in a wheelchair, in his room. When queried about his recollection of an incident involving a wallet, R4 stated I had it, and the man thought I stole it. R4 reported swearing at the man, who then came back and swore at him. When describing the interaction, R4 began raising his voice. R4 reported he forgot what the man said to him but reported cussing words were used towards him. When asked if he was called any names, R4 stated, cussing words .</p>
