The facility census was 62 residents. Review of the facility's policy dated [DATE], Transporting a Resident - Facility Van showed:-It is the policy of this facility to provide residents safe, non-emergency transportation to physician's appointments, activity outings, and any other trips the faculty deems necessary.-The van would be well maintained. -Facility liability and insurance would have covered staff transportation of residents. 1. Review of emails between the Administrative Team at the facility and the parent company showed:-On [DATE] needing to register the van. The license plates expires on Friday. Will need the title and a bill of sale to do this.-On [DATE] Are you able to track down the van title.-On [DATE] The parent company said: Have we received the needed titles yet? To be in compliance with the law, we need to be able to register our vehicles and we need the titles to register the vehicles. -On [DATE] they were reviewing which facilities currently had expired registrations.-On [DATE] the Accounting Department asked if they had been able to get the duplicate titles for the vans. During an interview on [DATE] at 1:10 P.M. the facility Van Driver identified that van as the one he/she used to transport residents to appointments.-He/She said that the van was used several times a week.-He/She said the license on the van had expired last year.-He/She had asked the facility what would happen if he/she was pulled over for an expired license plate.-He/She was told the facility would pay for the ticket.-He/She said there were other transportation services in the area that could have been utilized to take the residents to their appointments.-He/She would not have driven his/her personal vehicle with expired tags. During an interview on [DATE] at 1:30 P.M. Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) A said:-The facility's van license had expired last year, and the Administration knows about it.-The Van Driver uses the van a couple times a week to transport residents to appointments.-There was a logbook to write down when a resident needed transportation.-There were other</p> <p>(continued on next page)</p>
