<p>F 0689</p> <p>Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm</p> <p>Residents Affected - Some</p>	<p>Ensure that a nursing home area is free from accident hazards and provides adequate supervision to prevent accidents.</p> <p>Based on observation, staff interview, review of Safety Data Sheets (SDS), and review of the facility policy, the facility failed to ensure hazardous chemicals were properly stored. This had the potential to affect 28 independently mobile and cognitively impaired residents residing on the west and south units. The facility census was 106 residents. Findings include:1. Observation on 03/17/26 at 9:21 A.M. revealed there was an open container of wipes labeled Sani-Cloth Plus Germicidal Disposable Cloth located on the floor under a desk at a nurses' station on the west unit. The label on the wipes indicated they should be kept out of reach of children and could be hazardous to humans and domestic animals. There was also an open container of wipes labeled Sani-Hands Instant Sanitizing Wipes. The label on the wipes indicated they should be kept out of reach of children unless under adult supervision and to obtain medical help or contact a poison center immediately if swallowed. Interview on 03/17/26 at 9:29 A.M. with the Executive Director (ED) confirmed the open containers of wipes on the west unit should have been locked up.2. Observation on 03/17/26 at 9:34 A.M. revealed there was an open container of wipes labeled Sani-Cloth Plus Germicidal Disposable Cloth located in an unlocked cabinet in the hallway outside of the activities area on the south unit. Interview on 03/17/26 at 9:34 A.M. with Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) #373 confirmed the open container of wipes was being stored in an unlocked cabinet. LPN #373 further confirmed she did not have a key to lock or unlock the cabinet.3. Observation on 03/17/26 at 9:37 A.M. revealed there were two open containers of wipes labeled Sani Hands Instant Sanitizing Wipes in the nurses' station on the south unit. There was also an open container of wipes labeled Clorox Healthcare Bleach Germicidal Wipes in the nurses' station on the south unit. The label on the wipes indicated they should be kept out of reach of children and could be hazardous to humans and domestic animals. Interview on 03/17/26 at 9:46 A.M. with the ED confirmed the wipes in the south unit nurses' station should have been locked up.4. Observation on 03/17/26 at 9:48 A.M. revealed there was an open spray bottle labeled Ecolab Lemon Lift Heavy Duty Kitchen &amp; Bathroom Cleaner with Bleach in an unlocked cabinet under the sink in a south unit dining area. The label indicated it was for industrial use only and should be kept out of reach of children and should not be ingested. There were also an open container of wipes labeled Sani-Cloth Germicidal Disposable Cloth and an open container labeled Clean-n-Mean Waterless Hand Cleaner in an unlocked cabinet above the sink. The label on the hand cleaner indicated it was for external use only, should not be used in the eyes, and should be kept out of the reach of children. Interview on 03/17/26 at 9:59 A.M. with the Director of Plant Operations (DPO) confirmed the items in the unlocked cabinets in the south unit dining area should have been locked up. Review of the SDS for Sani-Cloth Plus Germicidal Disposable Cloths revealed the wipes could cause eye irritation and mild skin irritation. Review of the SDS for Sani-Hands Instant Sanitizing Wipes revealed the wipes could cause serious eye irritation, might cause respiratory irritation and might cause drowsiness or dizziness. Review of the SDS for Clorox Healthcare Bleach Germicidal Wipes revealed the wipes should be kept out of reach of children and users should avoid contact with eyes and skin and wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Review of the SDS for Ecolab Lemon Lift revealed it should be kept out of reach of children and could cause serious skin and eye irritation. Review of the (continued on next page)</p>
