<p>F 0880</p> <p>Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm</p> <p>Residents Affected - Many</p>	<p>Provide and implement an infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Based on observation, interview and review of facility policy, the facility did not ensure infection control practices were maintained in three of three linen closets for sanitary linen storage. This had the potential to affect all 64 residents residing in the facility. Findings include: An observation was conducted on 02/17/26 at 10:50 A.M. with Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) #329 of the second floor clean storage linen closet. A very large pile of socks was on the ground in the closet with a dirty pair of shoes on top of the socks. Multiple items of clothing, hospital gowns and bedsheets were on the ground, and various items of trash were sitting on shelving units with clean linens. An interview with CNA #329 at the time of the observation confirmed the findings. An observation on 02/17/26 at 11:00 A.M. with Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) #382 of the first floor 100 hall clean linen closet revealed there were multiple bedsheets, trash bags and various Styrofoam cups and plastic bags on the ground. There were also Styrofoam cups and plastic bags of trash sitting on the shelves with the clean linens. LPN #382 verified the findings at the time of the observation. Further observation on 02/17/26 at 11:02 A.M. with LPN #382 of the first-floor linen closet on the 400-hall revealed various Styrofoam cups and plastic bags on the floor. The shelves that held clean linens had various dirt and splatter stains all over the shelves. Multiple sheets had black lint on them. LPN #382 verified the findings at the time of the observation and placed a call to housekeeping to get linen closets cleaned. An interview on 02/18/26 at 12:30 P.M. with the Administrator confirmed all residents use the linens and towels from the facility linen closets. Review of facility policy Departmental (Environmental Services) Laundry and Linen, dated January 2014, revealed soiled and clean linen should be separated at all times. Clean linen will remain hygienically clean through measures designed to protect it from environmental contamination and reprocess any linen that is not visibly clean upon completion of the cycle or any linen that falls onto the floor.</p>
