F 0684 Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm Residents Affected - Few	Provide appropriate treatment and care according to orders, resident's preferences and goals. **NOTE- TERMS IN BRACKETS HAVE BEEN EDITED TO PROTECT CONFIDENTIALITY** Based on a review of select facility policy, clinical records, medication administration audit reports, and staff interview, it was determined the facility failed to provide nursing services consistent with professional standards of practice by failing to ensure licensed nurses administered medications within required timeframes for 1 of 11 residents reviewed (Resident CR1). Findings included: According to the Pennsylvania Code, Title 49, Professional and Vocational Standards, State Board of Nursing, 21.11 (a)(1)(2)(4) indicates the registered nurse (RN) was to carry out nursing care actions that promote, maintain, and restore the well-being of individuals. The Pennsylvania Code, Title 49, Professional and Vocational Standards, State Board of Nursing, 21.145 Functions of the Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) (a) The LPN is prepared to function as a member of the health-care team by exercising sound judgement based on preparation, knowledge, skills, understandings and past experiences in nursing situations. The LPN participates in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of nursing care in settings where nursing takes place. 21.148 Standards of nursing conduct (a) A licensed practical nurse shall: (5) Document and maintain accurate records. According to the American Nurses Association Principles for Nursing Documentation, nurses document their work and outcomes and provide an integrated, real-time method of informing the health care team about the patient status. Timely documentation of the following types of information should be made and maintained in a patient's EHR (electronic health record) to support the ability of the health care team to ensure informed decisions and high-quality care in the continuity of patient care including Medication Records. A review of facility policy entitled: Medication Administration last reviewed by the facility on September 1, 2025, indicated that medications are administered within 90 minutes of the scheduled time. A review of the clinical record for Resident CR1 revealed the resident was admitted to the facility on [DATE], with diagnoses including chronic respiratory failure (a long-term condition in which the lungs cannot adequately provide oxygen to the body) and muscle weakness (reduced strength which may impair mobility or daily functioning). A review of the Medication Administration Record (MAR) revealed Resident CR1 was prescribed the following medications, including medications scheduled for administration at 09:00AM: Vitamin D3 25 mcg oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth once daily for supplement (Vitamin supplement used to support bone strength and calcium balance).Oyster Shell Calcium 500 mg oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth twice daily for supplement (Calcium supplement used to maintain bone strength).Ascorbic Acid (Vitamin C) 1000 mg oral tablet -administer 1000 mg by mouth once daily for supplement (Vitamin supplement used to support immune function).Multivitamin oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth once daily for supplement (Vitamin supplement used to prevent nutritional deficiency).Aspirin 81 mg oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth once daily for cardiac health (Medication used to reduce blood clot formation and support heart health).Bumetanide 1 mg oral tablet -administer two tablets by mouth twice daily for edema (Diuretic, also called a water pill, used to remove excess fluid from the body).Biotin 5 mg oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth once daily for supplement (Vitamin supplement used to support normal metabolism).Ropinirole 4 mg oral tablet -administer one tablet by mouth three times daily for restless leg syndrome (Medication used to treat uncomfortable sensations (continued on next page)
