F 0658 Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm Residents Affected - Few	Ensure services provided by the nursing facility meet professional standards of quality. Based on observation, interview, and record review, the facility failed to ensure professional standards of care were followed for one of three sampled residents (Resident 1), when the nursing staff did not administer ordered dialysis (a treatment to cleanse the blood of wastes and extra fluids artificially through a machine when the kidney[s] failed to function) medication. This failure had the potential for Resident 1 to develop negative adverse reactions, elevated laboratory (lab) values, and other critical medical conditions. Findings: A review of Resident 1's admission Record indicated Resident 1 was admitted to the facility in December 2025 with diagnoses which included chronic kidney disease (CKD, a medical condition in which kidneys are failing and require dialysis to survive). A review of Resident 1's Order Summary Report, dated 5/22/26, indicated, Sevelamer. (a medication used to control high blood phosphorus [a highly reactive chemical element essential for life] levels in adult patients with CKD who are undergoing dialysis) oral tablet 800 milligrams [mg, metric unit of measurement, used for medication dosage and/or amount]), Give one tablet by mouth two times a day every Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Give with meals; and 800 mg Give one tablet by mouth with meals every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, Sunday. A review of Resident 1's Care Plan Report, dated 5/22/26, indicated, .needs.dialysis related to.CKD.and, nursing staff to give resident the 12:00 dose of Sevelamer 800 mg tablet to take with her to self-administer with food on dialysis days. A review of Resident 1's Medication Administration Record for June 2026, indicated the nursing staff did not give Resident 1's ordered Sevelamer medication on Monday, June 15, 2026 through Wednesday June 17, 2026, for a total of nine missed doses. A review of Resident 1's Lab Results Report, dated 6/4/26, indicated Resident 1's alkaline phosphatase (phosphorus, a blood test monitoring for liver inflammation and/or blockages) level was elevated and out of range. During a concurrent observation and interview on 7/2/26 at 10 a.m. with Resident 1, Resident 1 stated she was a new dialysis patient, and wanted to live longer for her great grandchildren. During a concurrent interview and record review on 7/2/26 at 5 p.m. with the Licensed Nurse (LN), the LN indicated Resident 1 had missed her doses of Sevelamer, and stated, [Resident 1] takes [Sevelamer] three times a day, every day with her meals. The LN confirmed Resident 1 had missed all doses of Sevelamer from June 15 through June 17, 2026. The LN stated Resident 1's phosphate level was 148 on 6/4/26, and the normal range should be between 46-116. The LN stated nursing staff were expected to re-order medications one week before the last tablet was dispensed. The LN stated it was important for dialysis patients to receive [Sevelamer] to prevent elevated spikes in phosphorus levels.to protect [Resident 1's] liver. During an interview on 7/2/26 at 5:40 p.m. with the Director of Nursing (DON), the DON stated she did not know Resident 1 had not received doses of Sevelamer. The DON stated nurses were expected to follow physician medication orders as written for dialysis residents. The DON stated it was important Resident 1 received her doses of Sevelamer as ordered for quality of care, health, and safety. During a review of the undated facility's policy and procedures (P&P) titled, Administering Medications, the P&P indicated, Medications shall be administered in a safe and timely manner.as prescribed.The Director of Nursing.will supervise and direct all nursing.who administer medications.
