F 0880 Level of Harm - Minimal harm or potential for actual harm Residents Affected - Few	Provide and implement an infection prevention and control program. Based observation, interview, and record review, the facility failed to establish and maintain an infection prevention and control program designed to provide a safe, sanitary, and comfortable environment and to help prevent the development and transmission of communicable diseases and infections for 1 of 1 dining rooms reviewed for infection control practices. The facility failed to ensure the CNA-A knew the correct way to perform proper hand hygiene. The facility failed to ensure CNA-A knew the correct way to handle residents' dining utensils. The facility failed to ensure CNA-A knew the correct way to wear a surgical mask to prevent the spread of infection. These failures and deficient practices could place residents at risk for cross-contamination and the spread of infection. The findings included: In an observation on 04/29/2026 between 12:10 PM and 12:50 PM, CNA-A was observed to be wearing a surgical mask below the level of her nose while handling residents' food and leaning over residents. She was observed to perform hand hygiene twice during this time in which she put alcohol-based hand sanitizer in the palm of her hand, and rubbed her hands 3-4 seconds each time, then she held her hands in the air prior to grabbing residents' trays and food. CNA-A was also observed to be handling resident cups containing water and tea by grabbing cups around the tops (where the residents would have placed their mouths to drink from the cups). In an interview on 04/29/2026 at 12:55 PM, the ADON stated wearing a mask beneath the nose was ineffective and would not protect the person wearing it or the person they were caring for. The ADON also stated alcohol-based hand sanitizers should be used like soap in which all areas of the hands are rubbed together until they are completely dry, or approximately 20 seconds. She stated if it was not being done this way, then it was probably ineffective. The ADON stated cups should not be grabbed or passed from the rim because it could have caused cross-contamination and a risk for infection. In an interview on 04/29/2026 at 1:07 PM, CNA-A stated she was wearing a mask because her family member had been sick, and she did not want to pass it to the residents. She stated she was aware that wearing it below her nose was ineffective, but it frequently fell down on her face. CNA-A stated to use alcohol-based hand sanitizer, put the sanitizer in the palm of the hand and rub for approximately 20 seconds or at least until they were dry. She stated it was not effective if they did not rub their hands until they were dry, and she realized she had not done it the right way. CNA-A also stated cups should not be grabbed around the rim because it was where the residents placed their mouths, and it could have caused cross contamination. Record review of the facility's Hand Hygiene Policy, implemented 10/24/2022, revealed Policy Explanation and Compliance Guidelines: 2. Alcohol-based hand rub with 60 to 95% alcohol is the preferred method for cleaning hands in most clinical situations. 3. B. Rub hands together, covering all surfaces of hands and fingers until hands feel dry. C. This should take about 20 seconds. Record review of the facility's Infection Prevention and Control Program, implemented 05/13/2023, revealed Policy: This facility has established and maintains an infection prevention and control program designed to provide a safe, sanitary, and comfortable environment and to help prevent the development and transmission of communicable diseases and infections as per accepted national standards and guidelines. 15. B. Based on specific circumstances, employees with a communicable disease or infected skin lesion will be prohibited from direct contact with residents or their food.
